## CHAPTER CXCII.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature by Louisa Robb, late Louisa St. Clair, that in the year seventeen hundred and ninety-six, she intermarried with a certain Samuel Robb of Westmoreland county, that upwards of two years ago the said Samuel Robb did totally abandon his said wife, with six small children, entirely destitute of the means of support; she therefore has prayed the legislature to pass an act dissolving the marriage contract between her and the said Samuel Robb.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representalives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into by the said Samuel Robb and Louisa his wife, be and the same is hereby declared to be null, and void, and the parties respectively set free and discharged therefrom, and from all rights and duties under the same as fully and absolutely as if they had never been joined in marriage; but nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect or render illegiti-
