CHAPTER CXCIX.

*An ACT for the relief of the heirs of John Smith, an old soldier.*

65 dollars granted to Robert Gilmore.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer pay unto Robert Gilmore of Mercer county, attorney in fact for the heirs of John Smith, the sum of sixty-five dollars for arrearages of pay.*

CHAPTER CC.

*A SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled, "An act authorizing the governor of this commonwealth to subscribe to a loan opened by the government of the United States."*

Bank of Pennsylvania authorized to loan money to the governor.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the bank of Pennsylvania be and it is hereby authorized to lend to the governor of this commonwealth, such sum or sums of money as he may think proper to borrow from the said bank by virtue of the act to which this is a supplement, and upon the conditions therein mentioned, any thing in the act incorporating said bank, to the contrary notwithstanding.*

**SECT. II.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*  
 That in case the Philadelphia bank shall lend to the governor of this commonwealth, any sum not less than two hundred thousand dollars, in part of the loan which he is authorized to make and negotiate by the act to which this is a supplement, and upon the terms therein mentioned, except as shall be hereinafter excepted; the faith of this commonwealth be and it is hereby pledged that the said bank shall not be required to loan to this commonwealth the whole or any part of the sum which the said bank is required by its charter to lend to the commonwealth at an interest of five per centum per annum, until the sum loaned by the said bank shall have been paid by the commonwealth.

The Philadelphia bank authorized to loan 200,000 dollars conditionally to the governor.

**SECT. III.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*  
 That the governor of this commonwealth be and he is hereby directed to issue or cause to be issued transferrable certificates of stock for such sum or sums as may be borrowed by him by virtue of the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement, the said certificates to bear an interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable quarterly.

Governor to issue transferrable certificates of stock, &c.

**SECT. IV.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*  
 That the governor of this commonwealth be and he is hereby authorized to cause a subscription to be entered in the name of this commonwealth to the loan authorized by an act of the congress of the United States, passed on the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, in such manner as he shall think proper, and to cause the sum or sums which he is authorized to borrow, to be paid according to the provisions of the said act of the congress of the United States, at such bank or banks as he may think proper.

The governor authorized to enter a subscription to the loan of the United States, on behalf of this state.

**SECT. V.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*  
 That the state-treasurer be and he is hereby required to pay or cause to be paid when due or called for, the interest which may from time to time accrue upon any loan or loans which the governor may make by virtue of this act, or the act to which this is a supplement.

State treasurer to pay interest, when called for.

**SECT. VI.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*  
 That in case the said sum of one million of dollars cannot be obtained in the manner hereinbefore directed by this act, and the act to which this is a supplement, the governor is hereby empowered to appropriate such sum or sums of money out of the treasury of this commonwealth as he may think necessary without embarrassing the same, or to sell and transfer to the purchaser or purchasers so much of the stock which the state

In case the state loan cannot be completed as aforesaid, the governor may appropriate money out of the treasury for the deficiency.

Or sell bank stock, &c.

holds in the banks in Philadelphia as may be necessary to supply any deficiency in completing the said loan.

CHAPTER CCI.

*An ACT to provide for the erection of an arsenal, in the city of Philadelphia.*

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That there shall be erected, on the lot belonging to the commonwealth, on which there is erected a frame arsenal, in the city of Philadelphia, a substantial brick arsenal.*

An arsenal to be erected in Philadelphia.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said arsenal shall be of such dimensions as to admit of the convenient storage of any number not exceeding twenty-eight pieces of artillery, with the necessary apparatus thereto belonging, ten thousand musquets, one thousand tents, six thousand knapsacks, and one thousand camp kettles, and also to afford sufficient space for three persons to work therein in repairing arms.*

The dimensions thereof.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That as soon as conveniently may be after the passage of this act, the governor of this commonwealth is hereby required to determine upon the size, dimensions and materials, of the said arsenal, and to cause a notice to be published in one or more of the newspapers published in the city of Philadelphia, calling for proposals for building the said arsenal ; and as soon as the said proposals shall have been received, the governor of this commonwealth shall contract with such persons as in his judgment will complete the work in the most substantial manner, and shall require and take sufficient security for the faithful performance of the contracts ; provided, that the lower story of the said arsenal shall be arched, that the roof shall be covered with slate or tiles, and that the cost of the said arsenal shall not exceed fifteen thousand dollars.*

Governor to determine on the size, &c.

And call for proposals.

And make contracts.

Proviso.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the sum of fifteen thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purposes herein mentioned.*

15,000 dollars appropriated to carry this act into effect.
