

if the said Charles Campbell, his heirs or assigns shall not, within four years from the date of this act, have manufactured salt from the said spring, or whenever at any time thereafter the said Charles Campbell, his heirs or assigns shall cease to manufacture salt therefrom, for a longer term than two years.

Salt works to be erected.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said Charles Campbell be and he is hereby authorized to erect or cause to be erected at or near the salt spring aforesaid, such works or buildings as may be necessary, in order that he may be enabled to manufacture salt; *provided,* that the works for this purpose to be erected, shall not injure or interfere with the private property of any other individual or individuals, or impede the navigation of the said river.

CHAPTER XIV.

A further SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled "An act to encourage the constructing of certain great and leading roads within this commonwealth, and the erection of bridges over the Susquehanna at Harrisburg, Northumberland, Columbia and M^cCall's ferry."

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the amount of the shares subscribed for by the governor, under the act of the second of April one thousand eight hundred and eleven, on behalf of the state, in the stock of the company incorporated for erecting a bridge over the Susquehanna at or near Harrisburg, shall be paid at the times, in the manner, and proportions hereinafter limited, and appointed, viz. the one fourth of said amount, on the first of August next, if half of the piers and abutments should then be raised ready to receive the wooden work, and if they should not be raised at that time, then to be paid when half of said piers and abutments shall have been so constructed; one fourth when the remainder of said piers and abutments shall have been constructed ready to receive the wooden

work ; one fourth when half of the superstructure of said bridge shall have been raised ; and the remaining fourth part when the said bridge shall have been completed : and on the payment of each fourth part, the president and treasurer of the said company shall deliver to the state treasurer, for the use of the commonwealth, a certificate for eleven hundred and twenty-five shares of stock in the said company, and no other certificates shall be required on the part of the state, for the shares held by the state, in the stock of said company. CHAPTER XV.

An ACT to authorize Isaac W. Norris, administrator with the will annexed, of Joseph Summerl, late of the city of Philadelphia, merchant, deceased, to grant and convey the real estate of the said Joseph Summerl, directed by his will to be sold.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for Isaac W. Norris, administrator with the will annexed, of Joseph Summerl, late of the city of Philadelphia, merchant, deceased, after public notice previously given in at least two newspapers printed in the said city, to grant, bargain and sell for the highest price that can be obtained, to any person or persons, their heirs and assigns forever, the real estate of the said Joseph Summerl, which by his said will is directed to be sold, and to execute, seal and deliver, and in due form of law acknowledge such conveyances and assurances of the said real estate, unto the purchaser or purchasers thereof, their heirs and assigns forever, as shall be requisite, in as full a manner to all intents and purposes as if he had been nominated and appointed executor of the said will : provided, that the said Isaac W. Norris before he enters upon the duties directed to be performed by this act, shall enter into a recognizance in the orphan's court of the city of Philadelphia, with sufficient sureties to the satisfaction of said court, conditioned that the duties mentioned in this act shall be faithfully performed, and*
