CHAPTER LX.

An ACT to annul the marriage of Michael Kapp, Junior, and Catharine his wife.

WHEREAS it appears that Michael Kapp has been in the habit of ill treating his wife Catharine, and in addition to his abusive conduct towards her, has neglected to provide for her support, and has given himself up to an irregular and immoral life: therefore.

Marriage contract of Michael Eapp, junior, &c. made null and void. SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into between Michael Kapp, junior, and Catharine his wife, of the borough of Harrisburg, he and the same is hereby declared to be null and void, and the parties respectively set free and discharged therefrom, and from all the rights and duties arising under the same as fully and absolutely as if they had never been joined in marriage.

CHAPTER LXI.

An ACT for the relief of the beirs of James Armstrong, deceased.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the accountant officers be and they are hereby directed to liquidate and settle agreeably to the provisions of the tenth section of the act entitled "Anact making certain appropriations and to enable the governor of the commonwealth to negociate certain loans, and for other purposes" therein mentioned, passed the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and three, the value of a new loan certificate of Pennsylvania, number fourteen thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, issued to James Armstrong for eleven pounds nineteen shillings and five pence, and the sum due thereon, shall be paid to Robert Jamison, surviving executor of said James Armstrong, for the use of his heirs or le-

CHAPTER LXII.

An ACT to repeal certain acts therein mentioned, relative to intrusion on lands in Luzerne and other counties within this commonwealth, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the act entitled "An act to prevent intrusions on lands within the counties of Northampton, Northumberland and Lu-pialed. zerne, passed the eleventh day of April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety five, and a supplement thereto, passed the sixteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and one; and also an "Act to maintain the territorial rights of the state, and protect the property of persons holding lands under the same," passed the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and two, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECT. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That any deed or conveyance for lands heretofore executed. during the time the acts repealed by the preceding section Certain deeds were in operation, although the same did not recite the title and conveyances validated, &c. agreeably to the provisions thereof, are hereby declared to be good and effectual wherever and whenever the grantor in said deed or those claiming under him can shew a title derived from the late proprietaries, or from the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, any thing in the said acts to the contrary notwithstanding.
