## CHAPTER LXXIII. :

An ACT for the sale of the residue of the reserve tract of land at the mouth of Big Beaver creek.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That William Leet and John Wolf senior, of the county of Beaver, Commissioners to lay out lots in and James Dennis of the borough of Beaver, be and they are the reserve tract hereby authorized and empowered to lay out in lots of not less than five, nor more than ten acres each, all the residue of the reserve tract of land at the mouth of Big Beaver creek, which yet remains the property of this commonwealth, in such manner as they may deem most advantageous to the commonwealth, and prior to the first day of December next, to sell the same at public auction, at the court-house in the borough of Beaver, first giving public notice thereof, at least three weeks in one newspaper printed in Pittsburg, one in Washington and one in Beaver; and on the day of the sale the said commissioners or a majority of them shall attend and publish the conditions thereof, which shall be as follows: viz. the purchase money to be paid into the state treasury within two years from the date of such sale; upon which payment being made, and a certificate from the commissioners, or a majority of them, of such person being the purchaser, the secretary of the land office is required to issue patents to such purchasers of the lots so sold: provided nevertheless, that should such purchasers of the lots, sold as aforesaid, or any of them refuse or neglect to pay the purchase money, and procure their patents within two years after such sale as aforesaid, it shall then be the duty of the secretary of the land office, on the application of any other person or persons, and on the payment of the sum which was bidden for said lots with interest from the time such money became due, to issue a patent or Patents to such applicant or applicants which shall vest a title as fully and effectually as though such person had been the original purchaser.
