

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the secretary of the land office is hereby required on application to him made, to transmit a draft of the bounds of that part of the aforesaid reserve, which was sold on the tenth of June, one thousand eight hundred and five, to the commissioners aforesaid, who are hereby required immediately after they shall have performed the sales as aforesaid, to transmit a draft of the lots so laid out and sold by them to the secretary of the land office, with a duplicate containing the names of the purchasers and the sum for which each lot was sold.

Secretary of land office to transmit drafts to the commissioners.

Who after sales shall transmit drafts of lots sold to secretary of land office, and names of purchasers.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That each of the said commissioners shall receive two dollars for each day they shall necessarily spend in performing the duties aforesaid; and reasonable expenses for surveying, advertising, &c. to be paid by the state treasurer on the settlement of their accounts.

Compensation to commissioners.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the public square situate in the north west corner of the general plan of the town of Beaver, which was reserved for public purposes be, and the same is hereby appropriated for a burial ground:

CHAPTER LXXIV.

An ACT providing for the payment of the detachment of militia which marched to the defence of Elkton in Maryland.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the detachment of the first brigade of the third division of Pennsylvania militia, which in May last marched to the defence of Elkton in Maryland, shall be entitled to receive from this commonwealth, the same pay and emoluments for the said service, as if they had been called out in pursuance of the second section of the act entitled, "A further supplement to the act for the regulation of the militia of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania," passed the twenty-ninth of March, eighteen hundred and thirteen; and the accounting officers are hereby authorized and directed to

CHAPTER LXXV.

A SUPPLEMENT to “*An act to enable the purchasers at sheriffs or coroners sales to obtain possession.*”

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That any person or persons in possession under the defendant or defendants, in the execution on which the lands or tenements shall have been sold by title derived to him, her or them from the said defendant or defendants, before the judgment rendered against him, her or them under which the purchase may have been made, shall be entitled to all the rights, privileges and benefits contained in the second section of the act to which this is supplementary, and such person or persons shall not be dispossessed of the said lands or tenements by virtue of the first section of the said act.*

Persons in possession under defendants to have the benefits of the 2d. section of the original act.

CHAPTER LXXVI.

An ACT for the relief of Henry Lutz, Michael Langenback and George Bieghy, old soldiers.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be and he is hereby directed to pay unto Henry Lutz, Michael Langenback and George Bieghy all of Northampton county, or their order, the sum of forty dollars each, immediately after the passing of this act.*
