

SECT. XIV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the town council shall from to time establish the compensation of the several officers created by this act, or appointed by them in pursuance thereof; and if any person appointed to any office by the town council, shall refuse to take upon himself the duties thereof, he shall forfeit and pay for the use of the corporation, any sum not exceeding ten dollars, unless he can render to the said council a satisfactory reason why he should be exonerated from such service: *provided,* that no person shall be compelled to serve more than one in three years.

Compensation to officers.

SECT. XV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if any person or persons shall think him, her or themselves aggrieved by any thing done in pursuance of this act, he, she or they may appeal to the next court of general quarter sessions of the peace, to be held for the said county, upon giving security before a justice of the peace residing in the said borough, to prosecute his, her or their appeal with effect; and the said court having taken the premises into consideration shall make such order and decree therein as shall be just and reasonable, and the same shall be conclusive.

Appeal for redress of grievances to quarter sessions.

SECT. XVI. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the first Monday in May next, the act entitled "An act to erect the town of Bellefonte in Centre county into a borough," passed the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and six, be and the same is hereby repealed; but the repeal thereof shall not affect any proceeding commenced in pursuance thereof, but the same shall be finished and concluded as if this act had not been passed.

CHAPTER XCIV.

An ACT for the relief of John Robison and Alexander M'Curdy, old soldiers.

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby directed to pay to John Robison of Fayette county, or order, the sum of one hundred and thirty-four dollars and eighty-one cents, out of any money in the treasury.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby directed to pay to Alexander M'Curdy, or order, forty dollars immediately.

CHAPTER XCV.

A SUPPLEMENT to the act entitled "An act concerning the borough of Reading.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the inhabitants of the borough of Reading in the county of Berks entitled to vote for members of the general assembly, be and they are hereby impowered, at the same time and place and in the same manner they elect burgesses and a town council, to elect one person to be town clerk, one person as treasurer, one person as clerk of the market, and two persons as supervisors of the streets, lanes, alleys, roads and highwaysthereof; and if any person elected to either of the offices aforesaid, shall neglect or refuse to take upon himself the office to which he may be elected, he shall for every such offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding twenty dollars, to be recovered in the same manner as fines are made recoverable under the act to which this is a supplement, and that so much of the said act, as is hereby altered and supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed.
