SECT. XIV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the town council shall from to time establish the compen-compensation to sation of the several officers created by this act, or appointed by officers them in pursuance thereof; and if any person appointed to any office by the town council, shall refuse to take upon himself the duties thereof, he shall forfeit and pay for the use of the corpo- Penalty on reration, any sum not exceeding ten dollars, unless he can render fusing to act. to the said council a satisfactory reason why he should be exonerated from such service: provided, that no person shall be compelled to serve more than one in three years.

SECT. XV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if any person or persons shall think him, her or themselves Appeal for reaggrieved by any thing done in pursuance of this act, he, she or ances to quarter they may appeal to the next court of general quarter sessions of the peace, to be held for the said county, upon giving security before a justice of the peace residing in the said borough, to prosecute his, her or their appeal with effect; and the said court having taken the premises into consideration shall make such order and decree therein as shall be just and reasonable, and the same shall be conclusive.

SECT. XVI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That from and after the first Monday in May next, the act entitled "An act to erect the town of Bellefonte in Centre county into a borough," passed the twenty-eighth day of March, one pealed. thousand eight hundred and six, be and the same is hereby repealed; but the repeal thereof shall not affect any proceeding commenced in pursuance thereof, but the same shall be finished and concluded as if this act had not been passed,
