CHAPTER CX.

An ACT supplementary to the act entitled, "A supplement to the act entitled, "An act to establish a board of wardens for the port of Philadelphia and for the regulation of pilots and pilotages and for other purposes therein mentioned."

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That if upon a settlement of the accounts relative to the warden's office and the expenses necessarily incurred in conducting the business thereof agreeably to the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement, it shall appear that the monies paid by virtue of the said act to the master warden in any year from and after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, shall not have been sufficient to pay the said expenses, it shall be lawful for the auditor general to draw a warrant or warrants upon the state treasurer from time to time until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen and no longer, for the amount of such deficiency, which shall be paid out of the funds created for removing or clearing bars in the river Delaware: *provided,* Auditor general to draw his warrant in favour of the board of wardens in certain cases. Proviso. that the same shall not in any one year exceed the sum of one thousand six hundred dollars in the whole.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That that part of the sixteenth section of the act to which this is a supplement which authorizes the harbour master to demand and receive the sum of one dollar for each and every voyage performed by each and every ship or vessel arriving at the port of Philadelphia, shall not be so construed as to authorize the said harbour master to demand or receive any fee for any steam boat arriving at the port of Philadelphia: Steam boats to sail free. *pro-*

vided, that the said harbour master shall not be required to render any service in relation to the said steam boats.

CHAPTER CXI.

An ACT authorizing the state treasurer to pay to John Means a sum of money therein mentioned.

WHEREAS by an act bearing date the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, the legislature of this commonwealth did appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars for the purpose of building a bridge over Turtle creek in the county of Allegheny where the state road crosses the same: and whereas it has been represented to the legislature that since the passage of said act John Means has undertaken and completed a bridge over the said creek of excellent workmanship, but having made no previous contract with the county commissioners for building the said bridge he is unable to draw upon the state treasurer for the money appropriated as aforesaid: for remedy whereof,

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That on John Means producing to the state treasurer a certificate from the commissioners of Allegheny county of a transfer to them made for the use of the county, of a bridge built by the said John Means, over Turtle creek in said county, and also a certificate of their approbation of the site and work, the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to the said John Means the sum of one thousand dollars: provided, that the money so paid shall be taken and deemed to be the sum appropriated by the act of the second of April, one thousand eight hundred and eleven.
