CHAPTER CLXXXII.

An ACT providing for the settlement of sundry accounts for military expenditures therein mentioned and for other purposes.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the accounting officers of this commonwealth be and they are hereeers to settle the by required to adjust and settle the accounts for pay and ratia in a certain tions of all the officers, non-commissioned officers, musicians tions of all the officers, non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates of the militia comprehended within the sixteenth division called into service in pursuance of orders from the

major general of that division.

SECT. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, Also settle other That the accounting officers of this commonwealth be and they , are hereby required to adjust and settle the accounts for the purchase of materials and tools for constructing block houses at and near the town of Erie.

> Sect. 111. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That on all accounts settled under the directions of this act the auditor general shall draw his warrant on the state treasury, and the amount thereof shall be paid out of any monies in the treasury.

SECT. IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the state treasurer be and he is hereby directed to pay to George Rawls, or order, forty eight dollars and ten cents in full of his demand, for provisions furnished to the detachment of the militia under brigadier general Crooks.

SECT. v. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Jacob Bucher, one of the commissioners appointed to superintend the erection of the public buildings, be and he hereby is authorized and required to sell by public sale at any time before the first day of December next, such of the materials, tools and implements left about the buildings aforesaid as he and the secretary of the commonwealth may judge to be in a perishable situation or proper to be disposed of: and the said Jacob Bucher shall settle his account of said sale with the auditor general and pay the money arising therefrom into the state treasury.
