SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted, by the authority aforesaid,* That when thus incorporated the said president, managers and company shall in respect of the bridge to be erected under the provisions of this act perform the same duties, acts, matters and things, be entitled to all the advantages and the same tolls, privileges, rights and immunities, and be subject to all the rules, conditions, limitations and restrictions, which are provided or imposed on, or granted to the president, managers and company for erecting a bridge over the Allegheny river, opposite the borough of Pittsburg, by the act of assembly passed the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ten, as fully and effectually as if the provisions thereof were here enacted at full length.

CHAPTER CLXXXVII.

A SUPPLEMENT to the act incorporating the president, managers and company of the Anderson's ferry and York turnpike road.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Henry Share, George Snyder, James Mehaffey, Jacob Graybill and Thomas R. Buchanon of the county of Lancaster, and John Miller, John Sultzbaugh, George Upp and George Spangler, (surveyor) of the county of York, are hereby appointed additional commissioners to those mentioned in the first section of the original act, to perform with the said first appointed commissioners the several duties required of them by said act.

Additional commissioners.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the president and managers so soon as the company shall be organized as is provided in the original act are hereby authorized to change the route contemplated in the original act so as to intersect the Susquehanna and York borough turnpike at such place as the said president and managers shall think proper.

Route of the road to be changed.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if the company to be incorporated by the original act shall not proceed to carry on the said works in three years after the first day of May next, and shall not within seven years thereafter, complete the same according to the true intent and meaning of said original act, then in either of these cases, all and singular the rights, liberties and franchises granted to the said company by the act to which this is a supplement, shall revert to this commonwealth, and the proviso in the third section of the said act is hereby repealed.

When the privileges of the said company shall revert to this commonwealth.

CHAPTER CLXXXVIII.

An ACT to authorize Abraham Brouse and Jacob Harman to sell a tract of land therein mentioned.

WHEREAS it is represented to the legislature that a tract of land situate in Penn township, in the county of Union, containing one hundred acres and seven perches was granted by patent dated the twentieth of August, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, to Abraham Brouse and Jacob Harman in trust for the United Congregation of German Lutheran and Calvinists worshipping at Hessler's church in said township, that the said tract is wholly unproductive; that the congregation for want of funds are unable to complete their church and school-house; therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

That Abraham Brouse and Jacob Harman trustees of the United Congregation of German Lutheran and Calvinists worshipping at Hessler's church in Penn township, in the county of Union, be and they are hereby authorized to sell the whole or such part as they may deem expedient of a tract of land situate in the said township, containing one hundred acres and seven perches and allowance, &c. adjoining lands of Simon Espy, Michael Hessler, Martin Michael and John Reem, granted to the said Abraham Brouse and Jacob Harman in trust for the said congregation by patent dated the twentieth day of
