*To the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth  
of Pennsylvania.*

**GENTLEMEN,**

In obedience to the directions of the 46th section of an act, entitled "An act to amend and consolidate the several acts relating to the settlement of the public accounts. and the payment of public monies, and for other purposes," passed on the 30th of March 1844, I have the honor to submit to the Legislature the annexed report of the Receipts and Expenditures of the state treasury for the preceding year, ending on the 30th of November last.

No. I. Contains a detailed statement of the receipts and payments at the treasury during the year, and which exhibits a balance in favor of the commonwealth of thirty-six thousand one hundred sixty-seven dollars and five cents.

No. II. Contains a recapitulation of the amount received and paid in each month.

No. III. Contains a statement of the amount received monthly for lands and land office fees, and which is included in No. I.
