CHAPTER XVII.

A SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled “An act to incorporate the Protestant Episcopal church of Saint John, at Yorktown.”

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the election for vestrymen, directed to be held on the fourth day of July, by the tenth section of the act to which this is a supplement, shall annually hereafter be held on Easter Monday, or some day in the same week; any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER XVIII.

An ACT for the election of a constable in the borough of Marietta, in the county of Lancaster.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the electors residing in the borough of Marietta, in the county of Lancaster, shall, on the third Friday in March, yearly, and every year after the passing of this act, elect two suitable persons, being citizens of said borough, for the office of constable, and shall return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be holden for said county, and the said court shall appoint one of them constable for said borough; which constable, when so appointed by the court, Constable may be elected in the borough of Marietta.

CHAPTER XIX.

An ACT to amend an act, entitled "An act authorizing the partition of certain lands in the counties of Armstrong, Indiana and Jefferson."

WHEREAS, the name of John Adlum, one of the parties on whose petition said act was passed, is omitted in the enacting clause thereof, by reason whereof the partition intended thereby, has not been made: Therefore,

Certain powers given to Charles Biddle & others.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Charles Biddle, Thomas Stewardson, James Vaux, Matthew M'Connell and Benjamin R. Morgan, of the city of Philadelphia, or any three of them be, and they hereby are authorized to do and perform all the matters and things in the said recited act mentioned, as fully, to all intents and purposes, with respect to John Adlum, and his share in the lands therein mentioned, as with respect to the parties who are named in the said act, and their shares, and as if the name of the said John Adlum were contained with those of the other parties in the enacting clause, in the same manner as it is in the preamble thereof, and that the deed of partition and draft mentioned in the second section of said act, shall be recorded in the county of Armstrong.*
