

CHAPTER XXIII.

An ACT granting to John Woodend the exclusive right to use a salt spring, which he has recently discovered in Toby's creek.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the exclusive right to use a salt spring, which has been recently discovered by John Woodend, on the north side of Toby's creek, about nine miles from the mouth of said creek, in Venango county, contiguous to a tract of land owned by him, be, and the same is hereby vested in the said John Woodend, his heirs and assigns forever: *Provided*, That this right shall cease if the said John Woodend, his heirs or assigns, shall not within six years from the date of this act, have manufactured fifty bushels of salt from the said spring, or whenever at any time thereafter the said John Woodend, his heirs or assigns, shall cease to manufacture salt therefrom for a longer term than two years.

Certain rights vested in Jno. Woodend.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said John Woodend be, and he is hereby authorized to erect, or cause to be erected, at or near the salt spring aforesaid, such works or buildings as may be necessary in order that he may be enabled to manufacture salt: *Provided*, That the works for this purpose, to be erected, shall not injure or interfere with the private property of any other individual or individuals, or impede the navigation of the said creek.

CHAPTER XXIV.

A SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled "An act for laying out, making and keeping in repair the public roads and highways within this commonwealth, and for laying out private roads."

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That when any road, reported to be necessary, by viewers or reviewers, who shall have been appointed to lay out the same, shall have been confirmed by the court of Quarter Sessions of any county, and after confirmation, and before the same shall be opened, shall appear to the original petitioners who applied therefor to be useless, and if opened will become burthensome, it shall be law-
