CHAPTER XXVI.

An ACT to erect Pottstown, in the county of Montgomery, into a borough.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Pottstown Pottstown, in the county of Montgomery, be, and the same is crected into hereby erected into a borough; bounded and limited as follows, a borough. that is to say, Beginning at a stake on the northern bank of the river Schuylkill, thence through Jacob Lesher's land, north twen-Its boundaty-five degrees, east one hundred perches, to a post on the eastries side of the road leading from the Monatawney ford on Schuylkill to Glasgow; thence by the east side of said road, north fifteen degrees, east forty-seven perches, to Beach street; thence by Beach street, and on the line dividing the lands of the estate of the late Mary Jones, deceased, from the lands of Mary Graham, David Rutter, the estate of Clifford Smith, deceased, and Joanna Potts, south eighty degrees, east two hundred and twenty-five perches, to a stake in a line of Peter Richard's land; thence through Peter Richard's land, south fifty-eight degrees, east sixtythree perches, to a post, and south twenty-four degrees, west one hundred and eleven perches, to a post a corner of Jacob Hubley's land; thence on the line which divides Jacob Hubley's land from Peter Richard's land, south forty-one degrees thirty minutes, west eighty-three perches, to the river Schuylkill; thence up the said river, the several courses thereof, two hundred and sixty-eight perches, to the place of beginning.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,

of the said election, which shall be regulated and conducted according to the general election law of this commonwealth, so far as relates to receiving and counting votes, and who shall be subject to the same penalties for mal-practices, as by the said law is imposed; and the said judges, inspectors and clerks, before they enter upon the duties of their offices, shall each take an oath or affirmation, before any justice of the peace of said county, to perform the same with fidelity, and after the said election shall be closed, shall declare the person having the greatest number of votes to be duly elected; and in case any two or more candidates shall have Proceedings an equal number of votes, the preference shall be determined by lot, to be drawn by the judges and inspector, whereupon duplicate equal number returns thereof shall be signed by the said judges, one of which of votes, &c. shall be transmitted to each of the persons elected, and the other

Powers and privileges.

That from and after the second Tuesday in April next, the burgess and town council, duly elected as aforesaid, and their succes-Style of cor-sors, shall be one body politic and corporate, in law, by the name and style of "The burgess and town council of the borough of Pottstown," and shall have perpetual succession; and the said burgess and town council aforesaid, and their successors, shall be capable in law, to receive, hold and possess goods and chattels, lands and tenements, rents, liberties, jurisdictions, franchises and hereditaments, to them and their successors, in fee simple or otherwise, not exceeding the yearly value of five thousand dollars; and also to give, grant, sell, let and assign the same lands, tenements, hereditaments and rents; by the name and style aforesaid they shall be capable in law to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in any of the courts of law of this commonwealth, or before any justice of the peace or alderman, and to have and to use one common seal, and the same from time to time at their will to change and alter.

Penalty on refusing to serve.

Sect. iv. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if any person duly elected as aforesaid, burgess, or a member of the town council, or high constable, and having received notice thereof, as aforesaid, shall refuse or neglect to take upon himself the execution of the office to which he shall have been elected, every person so refusing or neglecting shall forfeit and pay the sum

Provided, That no person shall be compelled to serve more than provise.

Sect. v. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,
That the burgess and the members of the town council and high constable, before entering upon the duties of their respective offices, shall each take an oath or affirmation, before any justice of the peace Officers to be of said county, to support the constitution of the United States, sworn or and of this state, and to perform the duties of their respective officers with fidelity; and the certificates of such oaths and affirmations shall be filed among the records of the said corporation.

SECT. VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the town council aforesaid, to May make meet as often as occasion may require and enact such by-laws, and by-laws, &c. make such rules, regulations and ordinances as shall be determined by a majority of them necessary to promote the peace, good order,. benefit and advantages of the said borough, particularly of providing for the regulation of the market, streets, alleys and highways therein, and making permanent rules relative to the foundations of Regulate buildings, party-walls and fences; they shall have power to assess, buildings, &c. apportion and appropriate such taxes as shall have been determined by a majority of them necessary for carrying the said by-laws, rules Levy taxes. and regulations into complete effect; and also to appoint annually a town clerk, treasurer, two persons to act as street and road com-town clerk & missioners, and a clerk of the market, and such other officers as treasurer. may be deemed necessary: Provided, That no by-law, rule or ordinance of the said corporation shall be repugnant to the constitution Proviso. or laws of the United States, or of this commonwealth, and that no person shall be punished for the breach of a by-law or ordinance made -1 as aforesaid, until three weeks have expired after the publication thereof, by at least four advertisements set up in the most public places in said borough: And provided also, That no tax shall be laid in any one year on the valuation of taxable property, exceeding amount of asone-half of a cent in the dollar on the valuation of taxable property, sessments. unless some object of general utility shall be thought necessary, in which case a majority of the taxable inhabitants of said borough by writing under their hands, shall approve of and certify the same to the town council, who shall proceed to assess the same accordingly.

That the burgess, elected and qualified agreeably to this act, is hereby authorized and empowered to issue his precept as often High constates as occasion may require, directed to the high constable, or such ble to collect other citizen of the borough as the town council may direct, comfines and manding him to collect all taxes assessed and fines and forfeitures taxes imposed by this act, or by the ordinances and regulations of the corporation, and the same to pay over to the treasurer; and the said burgess is hereby authorized to carry into effect all by-laws enacted by the council, and whatever else shall be enjoined upon Town counhim for the well-ordering and governing the said borough; and the cil to be a town council shall be a court of appeal, a majority of whom shall court of appeal be a quorum, and prior to the collection of any borough tax, the col-peal lector shall inform each inhabitant of the amount of his tax, and of the time and place of the appeal: Provided, novertheless, That Proviso.

said court of appeal shall have no other power, as such, than to determine the justness of the apportionment of said tax, and to remedy any grievance that may occur in imposing the same.

Duties of town clerk.

SECT. VIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That it shall be the duty of the town clerk, to attend all meetings of the town council when assembled on business of the corporation, and perform the duty of clerk thereto, and keep and preserve the common seal and records of the corporation, and be answerable

for the same, and also for the faithful discharge of all the duties which may be enjoined upon him by virtue of this act or of the acts of the corporation, and his attestation, with the seal of the corporation, shall be good evidence of the thing or act so certified. Sect. ix. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,

Treasurer to That the treasurer shall give security for the faithful discharge of give security the duties of his office, and for the safe delivery into the hands of his successor, of all monies, books and accounts appertaining thereto, upon demand being made by the burgess for that purpose. Sect. x. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,

That the street commissioners, treasurer, constable and clerk of the Accounts to market, as well as all other officers who may be appointed by the corporation or council, shall render their accounts to the council once in every year, for settlement, and the said accounts being adjusted and settled accordingly, shall be forthwith published by the said council, showing particularly the amount of taxes laid and collected, and of the expenditures.

Sect. xi. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That it shall be the duty of the high constable, to give notice of the elections, by setting up advertisements in at least six public places ble with re in the said borough, ten days previously thereto; he shall attend gard to elec-and see that the same is opened at the time and in the manner tions. directed by this act: Provided, That the constable of Pottsgrove township shall publish and superintend the election to be held on the second Tuesday of April next, as herein before directed. SECT. XII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,

Right of appeal.

That if any person or persons shall think him, her or themselves aggrieved by any thing done in pursuance of this act, he, she or they may appeal to the next court of quarter sessions or common pleas, as the case may be, to be held for the proper county, upon giving security according to law, to prosecute his, her or their appeal with effect, and the court having taken such order therein as shall seem to them just and reasonable, the same shall be conclusive against all parties.
