SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the commissioners aforesaid, as soon as conveniently may be after said letters patent shall be sealed and obtained, shall give notice in two of the public newspapers in the borough of York, one of which shall be in the German language, and one in the borough of Gettysburg, and elsewhere if occasion may require, of a time and place, by them to be appointed, not less than twenty days from the publication of the first notice, at which time and place the said subscribers shall proceed to organize the said corporation, and shall choose, by a majority of votes of the said subscribers, by ballot, to be delivered in person or by proxy duly authorized, one president and twelve managers, one treasurer and such other officers as they shall think necessary to conduct the business of the said company for one year and until such other officers shall be chosen; and the said managers so chosen, and their successors, are hereby authorized to make a turnpike road from the west end of the borough of York, the nearest and best route to Gettysburg, in the county of Adams, and shall and may make such by-laws, rules, orders and regulations, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this commonwealth, as shall be necessary for the well-ordering the affairs of the said company, and generally have like powers, authorities and privileges necessary for carrying on and completing the said turnpike road, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications, restrictions, penalties, fines, and forfeitures, and be entitled to like tolls and profits, in proportion to the distance, as are given and granted to the president, managers and company of the Susquehanna and York borough turnpike road: *Provided,* That if the company shall not proceed to carry on the said work in five years after the passing of this act, or shall not, within ten years afterwards, complete the said road, according to the true intent and meaning of this act, then, in either of these cases, all and singular the rights, liberties and franchises hereby granted to the said company, shall revert to this commonwealth.

CHAPTER LXXXI.

An ACT to authorize William Hunter, of Butler county, to convey lands.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly*

met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for William Hunter, son and devisee of William Hunter, late of Muddy creek township, in the county of Butler, deceased, to convey to Matthew M'Culloch, all that fifty acres of land, adjoining lands of John Woods and Andrew M'Gowan, which the said William Hunter, deceased, did, by his last will and testament, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, devise unto his two grandchildren, Mary and William M'Culloch, children of the said Matthew M'Culloch, to be held by the said Matthew M'Culloch in trust for the said Mary and William M'Culloch, until they shall arrive at age, so that they may receive, hold and enjoy the same in the full and ample manner directed by the testament and last will of their grand-father, William Hunter, deceased.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall and may be lawful for the said William Hunter, son of the said William Hunter, deceased, to convey to John M'Culloch, all that fifty acres of land, adjoining lands of William Dodds and John Negley, in Butler county aforesaid, which the said William Hunter, deceased, by his last will and testament aforesaid, did devise unto his two grand-children, John and William M'Culloch, minor children of the said John M'Culloch, to be held by the said John M'Culloch in trust for the said John and William M'Culloch, until they shall arrive at full age so that they may receive, hold and enjoy the same, in the full and ample manner directed by the testament and last will of their grand-father, William Hunter, deceased.
