CHAPTER LXXXIX.

An ACT for the relief of Samuel Kearsley, of Cumberland county.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate, and House of Representatives, of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Samuel Kearsley, a captain in the revolutionary war, or order, the sum of fifty dollars, immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of fifty dollars, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, to be paid half yearly during his life.

CHAPTER XC.

An ACT authorizing the governor to negociate a loan for paying the militia and volunteers of this state, late in the service of the United States.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized, to negociate a loan or loans with any of the incorporated banks of this state, for such sum or sums of money as may be necessary to pay the militia and volunteers of this state, late in the service of the United States, not exceeding three hundred thousand dollars, at an interest not exceeding six per centum per annum, to be reimbursed at any time within three years.

Governor to make a loan.

Sect. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the auditor general shall ascertain the balance due by the Duty of the United States to the militia and volunteers aforesaid, and make re-auditor geneport thereof to the governor, who is hereby authorized and required, ral. in the name of this commonwealth, to loan to the government of the United States, the sum mentioned in the foregoing section, or such part thereof as may be necessary, on the condition and with the assurance, that the sum so loaned shall be applied to the payment of the militia and volunteers aforesaid.
