

CHAPTER CXX.

An ACT for the relief of James Kean, of Westmoreland county, Mary Taylor, of York county, Peter M'Bride and Philip Jones.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer pay unto James Kean, of Westmoreland county, or order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, to commence the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, to be paid half yearly during his life.

Gratuity of \$40 and annuity of \$40 to James Kean.

To Mary Taylor \$40.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Mary Taylor, of York county, or order, forty dollars, immediately after the passing of this act, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

E. Darlington appointed guardian to Peter M'Bride.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the annuity of forty dollars, which was granted to Peter M'Bride, by an act passed the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twelve, shall be paid to Edward Darlington, of Chester county, his executor or executors, or his or their lawful attorney, which annuity shall be expended by the said Edward Darlington, his executor or executors, in providing clothing and diet for the said Peter M'Bride; and it shall be the duty of the said Edward Darlington, his executor or executors, to make an annual return to the orphans' court of Chester county, on oath or affirmation, shewing how and in what manner he or they have executed the trust in him or them confided by this act.

Philip Landis, guardian to Philip Jones.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the annuity of forty dollars, which was granted to Philip Jones, by an act passed the nineteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ten, shall be paid to Philip Landis, of East-town township, Chester county, his executor or executors, or his or their attorney, which annuity shall be expended by the said Philip Landis, his executor or executors, in providing clothing, diet and lodging for the said Philip Jones; and it shall be, and it is hereby made the duty of the said Philip Landis, his executor or executors, to make an annual return to the orphans' court of Chester county, on oath or affirmation, shewing how and in what manner he or they have executed the trust to them confided by this act: and that so much of the acts which relate to the cases of Peter M'Bride and Philip Jones, as is altered or supplied by this act be, and the same is hereby repealed.
