

CHAPTER CXXI.

An ACT confirming the title of Abraham Warfel, his heirs or assigns, for ever, to an island in the river Susquehanna, called Willow island.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Abraham Warfel, of the county of Lancaster, shall have a right to improve an island, called "Willow Island," in the river Susquehanna, for the benefit of himself, his heirs or assigns: Provided, he do not obstruct or in any way injure the navigation of said river: And provided also, That Abraham Warfel, his heirs or assigns, shall not extend the improvements of said island more than thirty feet beyond the bounds and limits set forth in the patent granted to him by the commonwealth.*

CHAPTER CXXII.

An ACT authorizing William Speer and Clements Burleigh, to convey certain lands therein mentioned.

WHEREAS, it has been represented to the legislature, that Adam Hope, of the township of Mount Pleasant, in the county of Westmoreland, died in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, seized of a tract of land lying in the said township, containing one hundred and sixty-five acres, or thereabouts, and leaving a widow, two sons and five daughters, one of whom intermarried with William Speer, and died leaving five minor children; that the administrators of the said Adam Hope, being duly authorized thereto by agreement under the hands and seals of his surviving children, have contracted to sell the said tract of land, and the said William Speer, one of the guardians of his said minor children, has petitioned the legislature to authorize him to join, on behalf of his said minor children, in the sale and conveyance of the said tract of land.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That William Speer, of the county of Fayette, and Clements Burleigh, of the county of Westmoreland, or the survivor of them, guardians of Mary Speer, Jane Speer, Nancy Speer, Joseph Speer and John Speer, be, and the same are hereby empowered to make a good*
