

and the said road, from thenceforth, shall be, to all intents and purposes, a public highway, and shall be opened and repaired as required by the original acts by which the said road was laid, and the part or parts of said road or roads, which is thereby altered or relaid, be, and the same is hereby vacated.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That each of the said commissioners, before they enter upon the duties of their appointment, shall take and subscribe, before some justice of the peace, an oath or affirmation, faithfully and impartially to perform the duties required of them by this act, and they shall each receive three dollars for each day they shall be necessarily employed in the said work, together with a reasonable allowance for chain carriers and one marker, and the accounts of the said commissioners shall be adjusted and settled by the county commissioners of Fayette and Greene, in proportion to the distance the said road passes through each county.

CHAPTER CXXXI.

An ACT to provide for the adjustment of certain military expenditures.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the accountant officers be, and they are hereby authorized to settle and adjust the accounts of Wilson Smith, late quarter master general, for such accounts as have been paid by him, by the order of major general Mead, and also for his own services in that department, and allow him the same compensation which is prescribed by the act, entitled "An act to enable the accountant officers to adjust and settle the accounts of services and expenditures in relation to the militia, called into the services of the United States and of this state," passed the ninth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the accountant officers be, and they are hereby authorized to adjust and settle the accounts of Isaac Lynn, for transporting the baggage, &c. of a detachment of militia from Fayette county to the town of Erie, and also the accounts of George Boyd, for supplies furnished said detachment.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the accountant officers be, and they are hereby directed to

adjust and settle the accounts of Henry Jarrett, a captain of a troop of cavalry, late in the service of this commonwealth, by order of the governor, dated August twenty-seventh, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, for such sums of money as he actually expended on account of no quarters being provided for his troop, for the time he remained in the service.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That upon the settlement of the said accounts, the auditor general shall draw his warrant for any balance due to either of the persons aforesaid, on the state treasurer, who shall pay the same out of any unappropriated monies in the treasury.

CHAPTER CXXXII.

An ACT making appropriation to defray certain expenses of government therein mentioned.

Clerk hire in secretary's office.

Land office.

Auditor general's office.

Treasury office.

Surveyor general's office.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That for the payment of expenses hereinafter mentioned, the following sums are hereby appropriated, viz. For clerk hire in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth, for one year, two thousand three hundred dollars, together with the balance unexpended of the last appropriation: For clerk hire in the office of the secretary of the land office, for one year, commencing the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, the sum of three thousand seven hundred dollars, which, together with the permanent appropriation of sixteen hundred dollars, may be expended by said officer in the employment of as many clerks in his office as he may find necessary: For clerk hire in the office of the auditor general, one hundred dollars, in addition to the permanent appropriation of one thousand dollars, and the further sum of eleven hundred dollars, to pay for the employment of two additional clerks in said office, from the first day of April next: For clerk hire in the office of the state treasurer, two hundred dollars, in addition to the permanent appropriation of two thousand and sixty-six dollars and sixty-six cents: For clerk hire in the office of the surveyor general, for one year, commencing on the first day of April aforesaid, the sum of two thousand six hundred dollars, which, together with the permanent appropriation of two thousand dollars for that office, may be expended by the surveyor general, in the employment of as many
