

RESOLUTIONS.

CHAPTER I.

RESOLVED, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized and requested to call upon the several brigade inspectors within this commonwealth, directing them immediately to furnish an accurate return of the number of enrolled militia within their respective brigades, having due regard to the number enrolled in each regiment, battalion and company.

RESOLVED, That in all cases where the captains or commanding officers of companies have not made their returns to the brigade inspectors, they are hereby required, without delay, to make a full and complete return of all the enrolled militia under their respective commands.

CHAPTER II.

RESOLVED, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That when any account of monies expended by this state, on account of the United States, for military purposes, in aid of the present war, shall have been rendered by the auditor general of this commonwealth, to and adjusted by the proper department of the United States, if the monies cannot be immediately paid into the state treasury, it shall be the duty of the auditor general, and he is hereby authorized to receive from the United States, in the name and for the use of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, certificates or evidences of said debt, bearing interest, which shall be depos-
