CHAPTER LXXIX.

An ACT providing for the sale of the State House and State House Square in the city of Philadelphia.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby authorised and required, on Commissionor before the first day of May next, to appoint three commissers to be apsioners, neither of whom to reside within the city or county of pointed. Philadelphia, whose duty it shall be to proceed and lay out a street or streets through the public ground called the "State House Square," in the city of Philadelphia, in such manner as in their opinion will most conduce to the value of the property.

An ACT making an appropriation for the erection of piers in the river Delaware, at the borough of Chester, in Delaware county.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That \$10,935 32 the sum of ten thousand nine hundred and thirty-five dollars appropriated and thirty-two cents, now in the treasury of this commonwealth, for erecting collected by the board of wardens on the tonnage of vessels, piersat Ches-under the act entitled, "An act to empower the board of warter, out of a dens for the port of Philadelphia, to collect a certain tonnage certain fund for the purposes therein mentioned," passed the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and five, be, and the same is hereby appropriated to be employed for the erection of piers

SECT. 111. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That the said commissioners shall cause to be erected. placed and sunk in the said river Delaware, at the borough of Chester, two or more good and sufficient piers, for the security of vessels navigating the said river, and shall also cause to be built and constructed good and sufficient wharves, to be so connected with the said piers, as to afford a safe and easy landing from vessels coming to at the same; and for this purpose they shall have power to employ suitable workmen, and to obtain cessions to the commonwealth, of ground within the said borough of Chester, necessary for the erection and construction of such wharves and piers: Provided, That said cessions be obtained without any consideration from this commonwealth.

SECT. IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid.
