CHAPTER LXXXV.

An additional SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled "An act to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Harrisburg, through Lewis-town and Huntingdon, to Pittsburg."

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That for the purpose of making a turnpike road from the town of New Alexandria to the bank of the river Connemaugh, in Westmoreland county, opposite the point at which the Huntingdon, Cambria and Indiana turnpike road shall intersect the said river, the following persons, to wit, Nicholas Day, William Denniston, Zebulon Doty, Joseph Barnes and James Reed, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the duties hereinafter mentioned, viz: They shall procure a certain number of books, and in each of them enter as follows, "We, whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay the president and managers of the New Alexandria and Connemaugh turnpike road company the sum of fifty dollars for every share by us subscribed, in such manner and proportions, and at such times and places as shall be determined by the said president and managers, in pursuance of an act entitled 'An additional supplement to an act entitled, An act to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Harrisburg, through Lewistown and Huntingdon, to Pittsburg.' Witness our hands this day of \_\_\_\_\_ in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and \_\_\_\_\_." And shall give notice at least for one calendar month in one or more newspapers printed in the towns of Pittsburg, Greensburg, New Alexandria, Indiana and Huntingdon, of the times and places when and where the said books shall be kept open to receive subscriptions of stock to the aforesaid company, at which respective times and places some one or more of the aforesaid commissioners shall attend and receive subscriptions from all persons of lawful age who shall offer to subscribe in the said books, and every person offering to sub-

scribe in any of the aforesaid books, shall previously pay to the attending commissioner's the sum of three dollars for every share to be subscribed, out of which shall be defrayed the expenses attending the taking such subscriptions and all other incidental charges, and the residue shall be paid over to the treasurer of the corporation as soon as the same shall be organized.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That when twenty persons or more shall have subscribed one hundred and fifty shares of the stock of the company, the commissioners, or a majority of them, shall certify under their hands the names of the subscribers and the number of shares subscribed for by each, to the governor, who may then, by letters patent under his hand and the seal of the state, create and erect the subscribers into one body politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The President, Managers and Company of the New Alexandria and Conemaugh Turnpike Road Company," and by the said name the said subscribers shall have perpetual succession, and all the privileges and franchises incident to a corporation, and shall be capable of taking and holding their capital stock and the increase and profits thereof, and of enlarging the same from time to time by new subscriptions, in such manner and form as they shall think proper, if such enlargement shall be found necessary to fulfil the intent of this act, and of purchasing, taking and holding to them and their successors and assigns, and of selling, transferring and conveying, in fee simple or for any less estate, all such estate, real and personal, as shall be necessary to them in the prosecution of their work, and of suing and being sued, and of doing all and every other matter and thing which a corporation or body politic may lawfully do, and generally have all the powers, authorities and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications and restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures, which are given and granted to or imposed upon the president, managers and company under the act to which this is an additional supplement.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That for the purpose of making a turnpike road from the town of New Alexandria, in Westmoreland county, to intersect the Greenesburg and Pittsburg turnpike road at or near Pittsburg, in Allegheny county, Nicholas Day, Samuel Dennison, Jeremiah Murray and Hugh Bigham, of Westmoreland county, and Nathaniel Irish, George Sutton, Anthony Beelen, Francis Wilson, junior, and James Horner, of Allegheny county, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the duties hereinafter mentioned, viz: They shall procure a sufficient number of books, and shall give notice in the same manner as is prescribed by the first section of this act, of the times and places when and where the same shall be opened for receiving subscriptions to the stock of the said company, at which times and places respectively one or more of the said commissioners shall attend and receive subscriptions from all persons of lawful age who shall offer to subscribe in the said books, to the following form of subscription, "We promise to pay, the

president and managers of the Pittsburg and New Alexandria turnpike road company, the sum of fifty dollars for every share by us respectively subscribed for, in such manner and proportion, and at such times and places as shall be determined on by the said president and managers, in pursuance of an act entitled 'An additional supplement to an act, entitled An act to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Harrisburg, through Lewistown and Huntingdon, to Pittsburg.' Witness our hands this                    day of                    in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and                    .” Which books shall be kept open by the said commissioners at all such <sup>How long</sup> times and places as they shall appoint, and the said commis- <sup>may be kept</sup> sioners shall have all the privileges, and be subject to the same <sup>open-</sup> rules, regulations and penalties as are given to or imposed upon the commissioners in the first section of this act mentioned.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That when twenty-five persons or more shall have subscribed two hundred and fifty shares of the stock of said com- <sup>When letters</sup> pany, the commissioners or a majority of them shall certify, <sup>patent may</sup> under their hands and seals the names of the subscribers and <sup>issue.</sup> the number of shares subscribed for by each, to the governor, and thereupon it shall be lawful for the governor, by letters patent under his hand and the seal of the state, to create and erect the subscribers into one body politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of “The Pittsburg and New Alexandria Turnpike Road Company,” and the said <sup>Style of</sup> company shall generally have all the powers, authorities, rights <sup>corporation.</sup> and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications <sup>Powers and</sup> and restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures which are specified and referred to in the second section of this act, with respect to the company therein authorised to be incorporated.

SECT. V. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That after the said companies shall have been duly incor- <sup>Governor to</sup> porated, the governor shall subscribe, on behalf of this common- <sup>subscribe in</sup> wealth, for stock in each of the said companies respectively, <sup>certain pro-</sup> two-thirds of the amount, in proportion to the distance of said <sup>portions.</sup> road, as he was required by law to subscribe in the stock of the Greenesburg and Pittsburg turnpike road company, and to be paid under the same regulations.

SECT. VI. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the aforesaid corporations respectively shall be con- <sup>How corpo-</sup> ducted, regulated and governed by, and be entitled to all the <sup>rations to be</sup> provisions of the act to which this is an additional supplement, <sup>conducted.</sup> and of the third section of the act of the twentieth of March, one thousand eight hundred and ten, as fully as if the same were herein re-enacted, except such parts as relate to giving public notice, which shall be regulated by the by-laws of the said corporations.
