## CHAPTER XCIII.

An ACT to enable the governor to subscribe to a certain number of shares in the stock of certain turnpike companies.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby required and instructed to subscribe for subscribe fifty shares in the capital stock of the Clifford and Wilkesbarre turnpike company, and one hundred shares in the capital stock of the Bridgewater and Wilkesbarre turnpike

company.

Secr. 11. ## CHAPTER XCIV.

An ACT to provide for the erection of two arsenals,

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Arsenal to be there shall be erected on the lot of ground belonging to the com-erected at monwealth in the county of Dauphin, a substantial brick arsenal, Harrisburg and a substantial brick arsenal at Meadville, in the county of and Mead-Crawford, both to be covered with slate or tile.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That each of the said arsenals shall be of such dimensions Dimensions as to admit of the convenient storage of any number not exceed of the building ten pieces of artillery, with the necessary apparatus thereto ingbelonging, ten thousand muskets or rifles, sixteen hundred tents, ten thousand knapsacks, ten thousand cartouch boxes, sixteen hundred camp kettles, sixteen hundred mess-pans, and also to contain a fire-proof apartment with space sufficient for two persons to work in repairing or making arms.

Sect. III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That as soon as conveniently may be, after the passage of this act, the governor is hereby required to determine upon the Governor to size and dimensions of the said arsenals, and to cause a notice advertise for to be published in one or more newspapers printed in the borough proposals, of Harrisburg, and in one or more newspapers published at Pitts- and make burg, Mercer and Meadville, calling for proposals for building contracts. said arsenals, and as soon as the said proposals shall have been received, the governor shall contract with such person or per-

sons as in his judgment will complete the work in the most substantial manner and on the most advantageous terms, and shall take sufficient security for the faithful performance of the contract.
