CHAPTER CVII.

An ACT to authorise the governor to appoint commissioners to lay out a road from the west end of Brighton bridge to the state line, in a direction to Poland in the state of Ohio.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby authorised to appoint three commissioners, one of whom shall be a practical surveyor, to lay out and mark a road to commence at the west end of Brigh-Route of the ton bridge, in the county of Beaver, thence to Mount Jackson, road, and thence to intersect the state line in a direction to the Poland Centre road, in the first range of townships in the state of Ohio: And the said commissioners shall proceed to perform the said service at such time as the governor shall direct, and they shall deposit a copy of a draft of the said road in the office of Draft to be the clerk of quarter sessions in each county through which the deposited said road shall pass, and the said clerks respectively shall enter with clerk of the same on the records of the county, which shall be a record of sessions. the said road, and from thenceforth shall be to all intents and purposes a public highway, and shall be opened and kept in repair in the same manner as other roads laid out by the authority of the courts in each county.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That each of the said commissioners shall receive two Commissioned collars for every day he shall be necessarily employed in the ers compenservice aforesaid, with a reasonable compensation for the hands sation. necessarily employed in chaining and marking the lines of the road aforesaid, and the expense that may be so accrued in laying out and marking said roads in each of the counties through By whom which they may pass, shall be paid by the counties respectively, paid. in proportion to the distance said road may pass through the same, on warrants drawn by the commissioners of each, on the treasurer thereof, in favor of the commissioners to be appointed, the draft of the said road to be made by said commissioners:

Provided, That before they enter upon the duties of their ap-Proviso pointment, they shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation, before some judge or justice of the peace, to perform the duties

hereby enjoined with fidelity and impartiality, a copy whereof shall be filed with each draft of the road, in the respective counties.

CHAPTER CVIII.

A further SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled "An act for the prevention of vice and immorality and of unlawful gaming, and restraining disorderly sports and dissipation."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That if any person or persons shall, hereafter, set up or expose to be played at, for money or other valuable thing, any E O table, farro bank, or any other game or device, with cards or dice, or any other game of address or hazard, in any way or manner whatever, every such person or persons so offending, upon conviction thereof in the court of quarter sessions of the county wherein the offence is committed, shall be sentenced to imprisonment in the jail of said county, for any term not exceeding one year, and shall pay a fine to the commonwealth not exceeding five hundred dollars, at the discretion of the court.

CHAPTER CIX.

An ACT to incorporate the city of Pittsburg.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the inhabitants of the borough of Pittsburg, in the county of Al-
