CHAPTER CXXIV.

An ACT to continue and revive the act, entitled “An act to encourage the warranting and patenting of lands north and west of the rivers Ohio and Allegheny and Conewango creek,” and for other purposes.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all the provisions of the act entitled “An act to encourage the warranting and patenting of lands north and west of the rivers Ohio and Allegheny and Conewango creek,” passed the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, shall be and the same are hereby re-enacted and continued until the first day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventeen. Certain act continued.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That any person or persons who have received a patent or patents on mortgage, for any lands lying north and west of the rivers Ohio and Allegheny and Conewango creek, under the law of the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, entitled “An act to encourage the warranting and patenting of lands north and west of the rivers Ohio and Allegheny and Conewango creek,” and that any person or persons who shall hereafter receive their patents under the said law, shall only be required to pay interest on the principal due on such mortgage, or upon such lands from the expiration of five years after the date of the first improvement made on the land therein described. Provision in favor of mortgagors.
