

Mifflin. **SECT. xxxiii.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Turbutt, in the county of Mifflin, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by John Morrison, in said township.

Do. **SECT. xxxiv.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of Fermanaugh township, in Mifflin county, shall hold their general elections in the school-room of the Presbyterian meeting house in Mifflintown, in said township.

Berks. **SECT. xxxv.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Pike, in the county of Berks, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by George Oyster, in said township.

Schuylkill. **SECT. xxxvi.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the borough of Orwigsburg, the townships of Brunswick, Manheim and that part of Schuylkill township, in Schuylkill county, which lies west of the following described lines, beginning at the line between the townships of Brunswick and Schuylkill, where the road leading from M'Keansburg to Valley furnace crosses the said township lines, thence along said road to the top of Tuscarora mountain, thence in a direct line to the place where Zachariah's run empties into the river Schuylkill, thence in a direct line to where the Catawissa road crosses the line between the counties of Columbia and Schuylkill, shall hold their general elections at the court-house in the borough of Orwigsburg.

Butler. **SECT. xxxvii.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors residing within the townships of Parker and Venango, in the county of Butler, shall hold their general elections at the house of James Conly, in Parker township.

Westmoreland. **SECT. xxxviii.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors residing within Donegal township, in the county of Westmoreland, shall hold their general elections at the house of Robert Campbell, in the town of Mansville, in the said township of Donegal.

CHAPTER CXXVII.

AN ACT making appropriation to defray certain expenses of government therein mentioned.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

tives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Clerk hire in the office of the secretary commonwealth, \$2300.

for the payment of expenses hereinafter mentioned, the following sums are hereby appropriated, to wit: For clerk hire in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth, for one year, two thousand three hundred dollars: For clerk hire in the office of the secretary of the land office, for one year, commencing the first of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, the sum of three thousand seven hundred dollars, which, together with the permanent appropriation of sixteen hundred dollars, may be expended by said officer in the employment of as many clerks in his office as he may find necessary: For clerk hire in the office of the auditor general, one hundred dollars in addition to the permanent appropriation of one thousand dollars, and the further sum of eight hundred dollars, to pay for the employment of one additional clerk in said office from the first day of April next, and a sum of eighty-two dollars and forty-seven cents, a deficiency of the sum appropriated for clerk hire by the act of the thirteenth of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen: Auditor gen. \$100 in addition to permanent appropriation, \$82.47 for deficiencies.

For clerk hire in the office of the state treasurer, two hundred dollars in addition to the permanent appropriation of two thousand and sixty-six dollars and sixty-six cents: For clerk hire in the office of the surveyor general, for one year, commencing the first day of April aforesaid, the sum of two thousand six hundred dollars, which, together with the permanent appropriation of two thousand dollars for that office, may be expended by the surveyor general in the employment of as many clerks in his office as he may find necessary, and the clerk hire aforesaid shall be paid quarterly in the usual manner: For contingent expenses in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth, for one year, two thousand five hundred dollars: For contingent expenses in the office of the secretary of the land office, for one year two thousand dollars: For contingent expenses in the office of the surveyor general, for one year, including the expenses of the board of property, eight hundred dollars: For contingent expenses in the auditor general's office, one hundred and fifty dollars in addition to the standing appropriation, and sixty dollars to supply deficiencies in the appropriations of last session: And the sums hereby appropriated shall be paid by the state treasurer out of any money in the treasury, previous to which the officers holding the aforesaid offices shall exhibit their accounts and vouchers for said expenditure to the accountant department, to be adjusted and settled. State treasurer, \$200 in addition, &c. Surveyor gen. \$2600. Payable quarterly. Contingencies. Sec'y commonwealth, \$2500. Surveyor gen. \$800. Auditor gen. \$150 in addition, &c. and \$60 for deficiencies: Accounts to be exhibited

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That* six hundred dollars be, and is hereby appropriated for the payment of an additional clerk in the office of the state treasurer, if the business of the office shall at any time require it, which clerk shall be paid quarterly in the usual manner. State treasurer, \$600 additional, &c.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That* a sum not exceeding six hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to enable the secretary of the commonwealth to employ a competent person, under his direction, to enter of record the original charter of the province to William papers. Sec'y commonwealth, \$600 to record certain papers.

Penn, the original agreements between the lord Baltimore and the late proprietaries of the province, the unrecorded deeds for the lands and territories purchased of the Indians, now remaining in the said secretary's office, and in the office of the secretary of the land office, and such other public papers as the said secretary of the commonwealth may deem necessary to preserve from decay and loss; and the said secretary is hereby enjoined to have such charters, agreements, deeds and papers to be faithfully entered of record, which records shall be kept in his office; and the said secretary shall transmit to the respective houses, at their next session, a list of all the charters, deeds and papers so recorded, with an account of the expense incurred therein.

CHAPTER CXXVIII.

An ACT to enable the executors of Valentine Kloess to sell certain real estate.

WHEREAS, it appears to the legislature, that Valentine Kloess, of Northampton county, died seized of two tracts of land in the said county, and one other tract in the county of Northumberland, which tracts of land were, by his will, directed to be held by his widow and seven children, as tenants in common, during a certain term of years, at the expiration of which they are to be appraised, and the proceeds divided equally among the children: And it is represented, by petition from all the parties interested, either by themselves or by their guardians, that the provisions of the said will are in some parts impracticable, and that the authority of the courts is insufficient to grant relief in the premises: For remedy whereof,

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Maria Eva Kloess, executrix, and Jacob Kloess, Abraham Kloess and John Smith, executors of the last will and testament of Valentine Kloess, late of Bethlehem township, in the county of Northampton, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to sell, at public sale, notice of which shall have been given six weeks previously thereto, in one of the newspapers printed in Easton, and convey any or all the real estate of the said Valentine Kloess, as a majority of them may think necessary, and execute good and sufficient deeds or other conveyances to the purchasers thereof, and after payment of the just debts, make
