CHAPTER VIII.

AN ACT

To authorise John Heiney, John Silfius, John Fulton, and William Klippinger or their successors, to sell a part of a tract of land therein mentioned.

WHEREAS it is represented to the legislature, that a tract of land, situate in Moore township, in the county of Northampton, containing seventy six acres and one hundred and ten perches, was granted by deed from William Beck, dated the thirtieth day of September, one thousand seven hundred and eighty two, to Philip Drum, Casper Erb, and Henry Bartholomew, in trust for the use of the Moore township German congregation, and that the interest of the said congregation would be greatly promoted, if a law were passed to authorise the trustees of said congregation, to sell a part of said land, for the purpose of raising a fund to defray the expenses of erecting a church and school house:

Therefore.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That John Heiney, John Silfius, John Fulton, and William Klippinger, trustees of the German congregation, in Moore township, in the county of Northampton and their successors be, and they are hereby authorized, to sell and convey Trustees of fifty acres and one hundred and ten perches, being part of a German contract of land, situate in the said township, containing seventy gregation ausix acres and one hundred and ten perches, held by the said thoriesd to trustees in trust for the said congregation, and to apply the pro-tract of land ceeds of said sale towards the building of a church and schoolhouse.
