And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if the company authorised by this act to be incorporated, shall at any time issue any note or notes in the nature of bank notes, or carry on any business in the nature of banking, then or in either of those cases, all the powers and privileges granted by this act shall cease and be determined.
