CHAPTER XIII.

AN ACT

To empower the Mayor and Recorder of the city of Philadelphia, to take the proof of deeds and for other purposes.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, -That the mayor and recorder of the city of Philadelphia, shall

have power and authority to take the proof of all deeds, con-Mayor and veyances, mortgages, or other instruments of writing, touch-may take ing or concerning any lands, tenements or hereditaments, situ-may take proof of ate, lying and being in any part of the commonwealth, and deeds, &c. may take and receive the same fees as by law they are now and receive severally entitled to receive for taking the acknowledgments fees. of the same, which probates shall have the like force and effects as if the same were proved before a judge of the supreme court or any judge of the court of common pleas within this commonwealth.
