

CHAPTER XVI.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act for the relief of John Cavanaugh."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby required to pay to John Cavanaugh, or order, the annuity granted by the act to which this is a supplement: and so much of said act as is hereby altered or supplied is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER XVII.

AN ACT

Authorising Mary Painter, late Mary M'Creary, one of the guardians of the persons and estates of the minor children of Thomas M'Creary, deceased, to execute and receive certain releases for a tract of donation land in Mercer county.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Mary Painter, late Mary M'Creary, one of the guardians of the persons and estates of the minor children of Thomas M'Creary, late of Mercer county, deceased, is hereby authorised and empowered to execute a release to Samuel M'Creary, his heirs and assigns for ever, for that half of lot number one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, in the second district of donation lands in Mercer county, which the said Samuel improved, and on which he now lives, and to receive on behalf of real estate. Guardians of the minor children of Thomas M'Creary to execute and receive certain releases of real estate.

of and for the only proper use of the said heirs, as tenants in common, in fee simple, a release from the said Samuel M'Creary for the other half of the said tract or lot of land, agreeably to the contract or arrangement that existed between the said Thomas and Samuel M'Creary in the life time of the said Thomas in relation thereto: any other law or laws heretofore passed on this subject to the contrary hereof notwithstanding.

CHAPTER XVIII.

AN ACT

To enable John Boal and Thomas Wilson, administrators of Hugh M'Laughlin, late of the county of Union, deceased, to convey a certain piece of ground situate in the said county of Union.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Legislature that Hugh M'Laughlin, late of the county of Union, deceased, did, by parole contract, sell to a certain Uriah Silsby, a certain piece of land situate in White Deer township in the said county, and that the said Uriah Silsby paid to him in his life time the full consideration money for the said piece of land, but obtained no deed or conveyance:

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That John Boal and Thomas Wilson, administrators of Hugh M'Laughlin, late of the county of Union, deceased, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to make and execute to Uriah Silsby a good and sufficient deed in fee simple, and in due form of law acknowledge the same, for a certain tract or piece of land situate in White Deer township, and county of Union, containing one acre, forty perches and seven-tenths of a perch, strict measure, it being part of a larger tract of land of which the said Hugh M'Laughlin died seized: Provided, That*
