

CHAPTER XXXIII

AN ACT

To legalize and make valid the official proceedings of David C. Kulp, a justice of the peace of Montgomery county.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Legislature, that David C. Kulp, a justice of the peace for the fourth district in the county of Montgomery, while acting as a justice of the peace for the said district, was appointed an assistant assessor of the direct tax of the United States in the said county, whereby his commission as justice of the peace became vacated, according to the laws of this Commonwealth: And whereas the appointment as assistant assessor was incompatible with his office as justice of the peace, he continued to perform various official acts as a justice of the peace for the said district, until a new commission was granted to him by the Governor of this Commonwealth: And whereas various citizens of this Commonwealth and others may be greatly injured, unless the official acts of the said David C. Kulp be legalized and confirmed:

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the official acts and proceedings of David C. Kulp, a justice of the peace for the fourth district in the county of Montgomery, done and performed by him from the thirteenth day of April, eighteen hundred and fifteen, until the first day of June, eighteen hundred and sixteen, be, and the same are hereby declared to be legal and valid, so far as they may have been illegal or invalid by his acting as an assistant assessor of the direct tax of the United States for the above recited period, and shall be so regarded within all courts of justice within this Commonwealth and elsewhere, to all intents and purposes as if the said David C. Kulp had not accepted and acted in the office of assistant assessor of the direct tax of the United States in the said county of Montgomery.*
