

CHAPTER XXXIX.

AN ACT

For the relief of Mary Walker.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby required to pay to Mary Walker, of Pike county, widow of John Walker, deceased, or her order, forty dollars immediately, and forty dollars annually as long as she remains the widow of the said John Walker: *Provided,* That if the said Mary Walker should intermarry again or die, then the said forty dollars shall be paid to the guardian or guardians of the minor children of the said John Walker, for their education and support, until the youngest surviving child shall arrive at the age of fourteen years.

\$40 gratuity and annuity as long as Mary Walker remains a widow. In that case to her children, during the minority of the youngest.

CHAPTER XL.

AN ACT

To authorize the purchase of certain copies of Smith's edition of the laws of Pennsylvania.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Secretary of the Commonwealth is hereby directed to purchase, for the use of the Commonwealth, four hundred copies of Smith's edition of the laws of Pennsylvania: *Provided,* That the price to be paid for the same shall not exceed fourteen dollars per copy, to be paid for at the
