

CHAPTER XLII.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act to encourage the constructing of certain great and leading roads within this Commonwealth, and the erection of bridges over the Susquehanna at Harrisburg, Northumberland, Columbia and McCall's ferry."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised and required to draw his warrant on the state treasurer in favor of the president, directors and company for erecting a permanent bridge over the river Susquehanna at or near the borough of Harrisburg, for the sum of twenty-two thousand five hundred dollars, being the last instalment on four thousand five hundred shares of the stock of said bridge held by the state.

Company authorised to raise the tolls.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall and may be lawful for said company to raise the toll for every chaise, riding chair, sulkey or other two-wheel carriage, or a sleigh or sled drawn by one horse, from thirty-two cents (the present rate) to thirty-seven and one-half cents, and for every single horse and rider from eighteen and three-fourth cents (the present rate) to twenty-five cents.

Repeal of part of former acts.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the acts to which this is a further supplement, as is hereby altered and supplied, be, and the same are hereby repealed,

CHAPTER XLIII.

AN ACT

Authorising the guardians of the minor children of David Krouse, deceased, to convey a tract of land to John Garey.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Legislature, that

David Krouse, late of Upper Hanover township, Montgomery county, deceased, in his life time exchanged four acres and sixty-six perches of land, for four acres of land, with a certain John Garey, situate in the township aforesaid : and that possession was mutually given by the said parties to each other, of the said land, and peaceably held upwards of ten years, but that no deed of conveyance or article of agreement was executed during the life time of the said David Krouse ; and it being the desire of the parties concerned that title may be made :

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Isaac Shultz and Daniel Shultz, guardians of the minor children of David Krouse, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to convey, in fee simple, to John Garey, his heirs and assigns, a lot of ground containing four acres and sixty-six perches, bounded by lands of Jacob Shultz, John Garey and others, situate in Upper Hanover township, Montgomery county, which title shall be as good and valid in law as if the same had been made in the life time of the deceased: *Provided,* That John Garey convey the four acres of land exchanged therefor, in fee simple, to the said guardians, for the use of the minor children aforesaid.

AN ACT

Declaring Crooked creek, in the county of Tioga, a public highway.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passing of this act, Crooked creek in the county of Tioga, from the mouth thereof up the
