

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Jacob Linebach and Catharine his wife, late Catharine Epler, and Henry Shell, surviving administrators of the goods and chattels of John Epler, late of Bern township, in the county of Berks, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorised to make and execute a deed of conveyance, in fee simple, unto John Lerch, for one acre and twenty-six perches of land, situate in the said township and county, bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning at a post in a line of John Moser's land; thence by the same south one half degree west eleven perches and seven tenths to a stone; thence by said John Epler's land north eighty-eight degrees west six perches to a post, north twenty-two degrees and a half west forty-nine perches and three-quarters to a stone; thence by land granted by said John Epler unto the said John Lerch south twenty-three degrees east thirty-eight perches and six-tenths to a black oak, and north eighty-six degrees east eight perches and four-tenths to the place of beginning: which deed, when so executed, shall be considered as good and available in law as if it had been executed by the said John Epler in his life time: *Provided*, That the rights of any other individual or individuals shall not be affected by any thing in this act.*

CHAPTER LI.

AN ACT

To repeal the act entitled "An act to authorise the surveyor of the township of the Northern Liberties, in the county of Philadelphia, to re-survey, lay out and regulate Slessman's alley in the incorporated district of the Northern Liberties."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the*

same, That the act to authorise the surveyor of the township of the Northern Liberties, in the county of Philadelphia, to re-survey, lay out and regulate Slessman's alley in the incorporated district of the Northern Liberties, passed the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER LII.

AN ACT

To incorporate the town of Newville, in the county of Cumberland.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the town of Newville, in the county of Cumberland, shall be, and the same is hereby erected into a borough, which shall be called the "Borough of Newville," bounded and limited as followeth: Beginning on the bank of Big Spring at a stone heap adjoining land of the heirs of Gabriel Glenn; thence south sixty-one degrees west thirty perches to a white oak; thence north twenty-eight degrees west sixty-one perches and one-half perch to a post; thence south sixty-six degrees west forty perches and three-fourths of a perch, adjoining land formerly of Robert Walker, to a post; thence south sixty-three degrees west fifty-two perches, adjoining land formerly of Andrew Walker, to a white oak; thence south four degrees east one hundred and thirty-one perches and half a perch, adjoining land of the heirs of Jeremiah M'Kibben, to a stone heap; thence along land of said heirs north sixty-seven degrees east one hundred and two perches to a black oak on the bank of Big Spring; thence down the said spring along its several courses and distances one hundred and thirty-one perches and one-fourth of a perch to the place of beginning: *Provided always,* That there is hereby reserved out of the land contained within the aforesaid described limits, all that part
