

CHAPTER LXV.

AN ACT

Providing for the settlement of the accounts of John Phillips, late a paymaster of the militia, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the accountant officers be, and they are hereby required to admit to the credit of John Phillips, late a paymaster of the militia, the sum of two hundred and eighty-six dollars and fifty-two cents, being the amount paid by him to major-general Mead and his aids, for their services at Erie in the summer of eighteen hundred and thirteen. J. Phillips to be credited for certain payments.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the accountant officers be, and they are hereby authorised to allow the said John Phillips such additional compensation as they may deem reasonable, for his services in paying the bounty and additional monthly pay granted to the militia and volunteers under major-general Harrison. Allow him additional compensation for certain services.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the accountant officers be, and they are hereby required to adjust and settle the accounts of major-general David Mead and staff, for their services at Erie, in January and February, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, in the usual manner. Accounts of gen. Mead to be adjusted.

CHAPTER LXVI.

AN ACT

To enable Mary Zimmerman, administratrix of Peter Zimmerman, junior, late of the county of Union, deceased, to convey a certain lot of ground situate in Hartleton, in the said county of Union, to Elizabeth Smith.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-*

representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Mary Zimmerman, administratrix of Peter Zimmerman, late of the county of Union, deceased, be, and she is hereby authorised and empowered to make and execute a good and sufficient deed, and in due form of law acknowledge the same, conveying such estate in a certain lot of ground, situate in Hartleton, in the county of Union, marked in the plan of said town number thirty-one, to Elizabeth Smith, wife of Melchior Smith, junior, as was conveyed to the said Peter Zimmerman, deceased: Provided, That nothing in this act contained shall in anywise impair the rights of any individual or individuals, which shall remain as fully as if this act had not been passed.

CHAPTER LXVII.

AN ACT

To authorise the Governor to incorporate a company for erecting a bridge over the river Susquehanna at the village of Meansville, the seat of justice in the county of Bradford.

Commissioners named. *SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That William Means, George Scott, John Hollenback, J. M. Piolette, Jacob Bowman, Charles F. Welles, Eliphalet Mason, Burr Ridgway and Jonathan Stevans, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several duties hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, They shall and may, on or before the first day of June next, procure at least three books, and enter therein as follows: "We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president, managers and company for erecting a bridge over the river Susquehanna at the village of Meansville, the sum of one hundred dollars for every share of stock in said company set op-*
