And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the sum of two dollars per day be allowed to each of the said commissioners, for the time necessarily expended in viewing, surveying and laying out said road, which shall be in full for their services, and a reasonable compensation shall be allowed to chain carriers and axe-men: Provided the same do not exceed one dollar and twenty-five cents per day for each man employed.

SECT. 6. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That in case of death, resignation, inability or refusal to serve, of all or either of the said commissioners, it shall be the duty of the court of quarter sessions of the county of Crawford to supply any such vacancy, by a person or persons selected from the counties of Crawford and Erie.

CHAPTER XCIV.

CHAPTER XCV.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to incorporate the City of Pittsburg."

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That from and after the passing of this act, the mayor's Power of the court of the city of Pittsburg, shall have full power and au-mayor's court thority to issue process on all recognizances forfeited in said to issue procourt, and to prosecute the same to final judgment and recov-cess. ery, as effectually as the courts of common pleas may or can do.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-Jurisdiction said. Sect. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all costs accruing in criminal cases in the said Costs in cricourt, and for which in the court of quarter sessions the coun-minal cases, how paid. ty would be liable, shall be paid out of the county treasury.

SECT. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the recorder of the said city shall annually receive, Recorder's out of the state treasury, the sum of six hundred dollars, to salary. be paid quarterly, as a compensation for his services.

Sect. 5. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the recorder of the city of Pittsburg shall have power to issue writs of habeas corpus in all cases of insolvent May issue debtors, and criminal cases originating in said city, and to writs of habe-give relief thereon in the manner and as fully as the president or any associate judge of a court of common pleas in this Commonwealth at present may or can do, by virtue of an act of
