and in either of these cases, the chartered privileges hereby granted shall cease and revert to this Commonwealth.

CHAPTER CIV.

AN ACT

To aid the West Chester Academy.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Legislature, that an institution has been established at West Chester, in Chester county, and incorporated agreeably to law, for the instruction of youth in scientific knowledge, under the style of the "West Chester Academy," and that a large and convenient building has been erected, in which the various branches of useful learning are now taught, under the superintendance of the trustees of said institution: and further, that the expense of the building has exhausted the funds of the corporation, and that their efforts to maintain respectable and competent teachers, have involved them in pecuniary difficulties, which materially obstruct the prosperity of the school, and which, unless obviated, they are apprehensive may ultimately defeat the benevolent and laudable views of the contributors:
