CHAPTER CLXI.

AN ACT

Authorising John May to erect a toll bridge over French creek, in Crawford county.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That it shall and may be lawful for John May, his heirs or assigns, to erect, build, maintain and support a good and thorised to substantial bridge over and across French creek, at the place erect a where the public road from the town of Meadville, in Crawford bridge over county, to the town of Mercer, in Mercer county, crosses the French same, below the mouth of Little Conyaut creek, near the house creek. of John May; and the property of the said bridge, when built shall be, and the same is hereby vested in the said John May, his heirs and assigns forever: and as soon as the said bridge shall have been erected under the authority of this act, he, the said John May, his heirs or assigns, may, and they are hereby tollsforcrossempo wered to erect a gate, to demand and receive toll from ing the same.

travellers and others passing the same as follows, viz: For Rates of toll, every carriage of whatever description used for the purpose of trade and agriculture, having four wheels and drawn by six horses, eighty-seven and a half cents; for every such carriage, having four wheels and drawn by five horses, seventy-five cents; for every such carriage, having four wheels and drawn by four horses, sixty-two and a half cents; for every such carriage, having four wheels and drawn by three horses, fifty cents; for every such carriage, having four wheels, and drawn by two horses, thirty-seven and a half cents; for every such carriage, having four wheels and drawn by one horse, twentyfive cents; for every carriage, of whatever description, used for the purpose of personal accommodation or pleasure, having four wheels and drawn by four horses, seventy-five cents: for every such carriage, drawn by two horses, fifty cents; for every such carriage, drawn by one horse, twenty-five cents: for every carriage, of whatever description, used for the purpose of trade or agriculture, having two wheels and drawn by two horses, twenty-five cents; for every such carriage drawn by one horse, twenty cents; for every chaise, riding chair, sulkey or other two wheeled carriage of pleasure, per horse used therein, twenty-five cents; for every sled or sleigh drawn by four horses, forty-four cents; for the same drawn by three horses, thirty-one and a fourth cents; for the same drawn by two horses, twenty-five cents; and for the same drawn by one horse, twelve and a half cents; for every horse and rider, six and a fourth cents; for every led or drove horse or mule, four eents; for every foot passenger, three cents; for every head of horned cattle, two cents; for every head of sheep or swine, one cent; and all carriages that shall be drawn by oxen, or partly by oxen and partly by horses, to be rated in the proportion of two oxen for one horse: Provided, That no toll shall be demanded or taken from any person or persons attending funerals or divine worship; from militia men going to and returning from muster on days of training, from children going to and returning from school, or from persons attending general, special or township elections, but that they shall be allowed to pass and repass on those occasions free of expense.

Sect. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if any person or persons shall cut or destroy any piece or pieces of timber, or any plank or planks belonging to Penalty for the said bridge, or the breakers which may be thereto attach-injuring the ed, or shall remove any piece or pieces of timber from off the bridge. said bridge, or any stone or stones or other materials belonging in anywise to the said bridge or breakers, or otherwise wilfully damage the same, he, she or they so offending, shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay for every such offence, over and above the damages done to the said bridge or breakers, the sum of twenty dollars, to be recovered in the same manner as debts not exceeding one hundred dollars are or shall be by law recoverable, with costs of suit, for the use of the owner or owners of the said bridge at the time the offence shall have been committed.

Sect. 5. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That whenever the court of quarter sessions and grand Mode of rejury, in concurrence with the commissioners of said county, deeming the shall think proper, that the said bridge should become free, then bridge and the commissioners of the said county, together with the court making it shall choose four judicious persons, three of whom shall be toll free. chosen by the commissioners and one by the court, together with three other such persons to be chosen by the said John May, his heirs or assigns, and the persons so chosen as aforesaid, shall proceed to estimate the said bridge, and the sum agreed on by a majority of them shall be reported to the next court of quarter sessions; and if the court approve the same

the said commissioners shall draw a warrant in favor of the said John May, his heirs or assigns, on the treasury of said county, for the amount of the said sum, and on payment or tender thereof the said bridge shall be free; but if the said John May, his heirs or assigns, shall at any time, on reasonable notice, refuse or neglect to choose three persons in the manner herein before mentioned, the said commissioners may proceed, with the persons by them and the court so appointed, ex-parte, in making the valuation, and the same proceedings shall be thereupon had as if the said John May, his heirs or assigns had chosen three persons in the manner herein before mentioned.

Navigation not to be obstructed.

SECT. 6. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That nothing in this act contained shall extend to authorise the said John May, or any person whatever, to erect a bridge in the manner in this act before mentioned, so as to interfere in any way with, stop, injure or interrupt the navigation of the said creek, or prevent boats from crossing, or persons from fording the same.

CHAPTER CLXII.

AN ACT

Providing for the payment of the expenses of erecting a bridge over Black Lick creek, at the town of Buela, in Cambria county.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners of Cambria county be, and they are hereby authorised and required to pay, out of the fund of the county, to the supervisors of Cambria township, in said county, for the year eighteen hundred and sixteen, the amount of monies which the said supervisors have lately expended in the erection of a bridge over Black Lick creek at the town of Buela, in said township, which amount shall be
