Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the right, title and interest, which this commonwealth may have acquired, by reason of any escheat, or supposed escheat, from the want of heirs or any known kindred of John Cook, formerly of the township of East Fallowfield, in the county of Chester, deceased, in or to the estate real or personal whereof he died seized or possessed, shall be, and the same is hereby vested in Mary Cook, widow and relict of the said John Cook, deceased, to be held by her, her heirs and assigns forever: Provided, That no other right of this commonwealth, except that derived by the said escheat, or supposed escheat, shall pass by virtue of this act, nor shall the rights of individuals be in anywise affected or impaired thereby.

CHAPTER IX.

AN ACT

To vest in Ann Gibson the right of this commonwealth to the estate of her son Randolph M Donald, formerly of the city of Philadelphia, deceased.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the right, title and interest, which this commonwealth may have acquired by reason of any escheat, or supposed escheat, from the want of heirs or any known kindred of Randolph M'Donald, formerly of the city of Philadelphia, deceased, in or to the personal estate whereof he died possessed, shall be, and the same is hereby vested in Ann Gibson, the mother of the said Randolph M'Donald, deceased, to be held by her and her assigns: Provided, That no other right of this commonwealth, except that derived by the said escheat, or supposed escheat, shall pass by virtue

of this act, nor shall the rights of individuals be in anywise affected or impaired thereby.

CHAPTER X.

AN ACT

To vest in Catharine Herman, the right of this commonwealth to the estate of Samuel Herman, deceased.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the right, title and interest, which this commonwealth may have acquired, by reason of any escheat, or supposed escheat, from the want of heirs or known kindred of Samuel Herman, late of the borough of York, in the county of York, deceased, in and to the estate real and personal whereof he died seized or possessed, shall be, and the same is hereby vested in Catharine Herman, his widow, her heirs and assigns forever: Provided, That nothing in this act shall prejudice the rights of individuals.
