CHAPTER XXXII.

AN ACT

To suspend the collection of the debt due to the Commonwealth, by the late John Cadwallader, of Huntingdon county, deceased.

WHEREAS John Cadwallader, late of Huntingdon county, deceased, was indebted on mortgage to the Commonwealth, in the sum of four hundred dollars or thereabouts with interest, which yet remains unpaid; and it is represented to the legislature, that if payment was at present enforced by a sale of the premises mortgaged, his widow and children, who are in indigent circumstances, would be thereby greatly distressed. Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all proceedings to enforce the payment of the debt due the Commonwealth on mortgage, by the late John Cadwallader, of Huntingdon county, be and they are hereby suspended for five years, from and after the passing of this act: Provided, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect or impair the security which the Commonwealth now has for the payment of said debt.*
