

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the executor or executors of the reverend David Smith, late of Westmoreland county, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to make and execute to Abner M'Donald a good and sufficient deed in fee simple, and in due form of law acknowledge the same for part of a certain tract of land situate in Fayette county, lately sold by the heirs of Isaac M'Donald, deceased, to Noble M'Cormick, containing about eighteen acres and twenty-six perches more or less according to the metes and bounds described in the article of agreement made by and between Isaac M'Donald, deceased, and Joseph Darlington, and dated the first day of October one thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, it being part of a larger tract of land sold by Joseph Darlington to the reverend David Smith, late of Westmoreland county, deceased: *Provided,* That nothing contained in this act shall in any wise impair the rights of any other individual or individuals whatsoever.

CHAPTER XLII.

AN ACT

For the relief of William M'Clean.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the accountant officers be, and there are hereby authorised and required to settle and adjust upon equitable principles the accounts and claims of William M'Clean for six days service of the team he had in the service of the state, and allow him pay equal to the pay and rations of an ensign

during the time he served as a forage master in colonel Rees Hill's regiment of Pennsylvania militia; and the State Treasurer is hereby required to pay the amount so found due to the said M'Clean.

CHAPTER XLIII.

AN ACT

Incorporating the Presbyterian Congregation of Salem in Derry township, in the county of Westmoreland.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the trustees of the Presbyterian congregation of Salem in Derry township, in the county of Westmoreland, shall be, and they are hereby erected into one body politic and corporate in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The trustees of the Presbyterian congregation of Salem in Derry township, in the county of Westmoreland," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in all courts of law and elsewhere, and shall be able and capable in law and equity, to take and to hold to them and their successors for the use of said congregation, lands and tenements, goods and chattels of whatever kind, nature or quality, real, personal or mixed, by gift, grant, bargain, sale, conveyance, assurance, will, devise or bequest from any person or persons whomsoever, capable of making the same, and to erect such buildings, and do all other lawful acts and things for the interest, well being, and due management of the affairs of said congregation, as a majority of the members of said congregation may direct: *Provided,* That the yearly value or income of said estate or money shall not at any time exceed twelve hundred dollars.

The Presbyterian congregation in Derry township, Westmoreland county, incorporated.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the trustees of said congregation shall be five in
