CHAPTER LIX.

AN ACT

For the inspection of herring, shad and other salted fish in the borough of Columbia, in the county of Lancaster, and in the city of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the first day of April next, all salt-Salted fish to ed fish, not previously inspected elsewhere according to law, be inspected brought to the borough of Columbia for sale, shall be inspect-in the boed agreeably to the previsions of this act, and a person skilful rough of Columbia in the goodness, quality and well curing of salted fish, shall An inspector be appointed inspector thereof. And it shall and may be to be appointawful for said inspector to appoint a deputy, who shall have ted. the same power and be allowed the same fees as the said in-Deputy inspector: Provided nevertheless, The said inspector shall be Proviso. answerable for the conduct of his deputy.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all salted fish in barrels and half barrels, brought Description to the said borough of Columbia for sale or transportation, of the casks shall be in such casks as the inspector may judge merchantato be used ble, sound and fit for transportation, tightened with at least for barrels and half bartwelve good and sufficient hoops, nailed with three nails and half bartels in each chine-hoop, and three nails in each upper bilgehoop, sufficient in every respect to hold pickle, and of the following dimensions, to wit: The length of the stave when in the cask, shall be twenty-seven and an half inches, the
