CHAPTER LXVIII.

AN ACT

Authorising the sale of the real estate of Richard Chester, deceased.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Jacob Ernst, administrator de bonis non with the will annexed, of Richard Chester, late of the county of York, deceased, be and he is hereby authorised to sell all the right, interest and estate which belonged to the said deceased, or was vested in him at his decease, in any real estate lying and being in this Commonwealth, and sufficient assurances in law to make to any purchaser or purchasers; the proceeds of such sales to be applied, in the legal course of administration, to the discharge of the deceased's debts, and such charges as the orphans' court of the said county shall allow, and the residue if any to be applied according to the last will and testament of the deceased: Provided, That the said Jacob Ernst, before he proceed to sell and convey any part of the said real estate, enter into a recognizance with sufficient surety in the said court, for the faithful discharge of the powers conferred, and the several duties imposed and required by this act; and in case of his decease, before he shall have fully discharged such duties, that his legal representatives shall render a just and true account of his administration, and shall pay over and deliver to his successor in the administration of said estate, all monies and securities that may be remaining according to such account.

In aid of the Harrisburg Academy.

SECT. 4. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General

Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of one thousand dollars is hereby granted to the trustees of the Harrisburg Academy, to be applied by them to the payment of the debts of the institution, and to the completion of the building erected for the said academy, and that the same be paid by warrant of the Governor on the State Treasurer.

CHAPTER LXX.

AN ACT

Granting a review on a part of a State Road laid out from John G. Parke's to M'Call's Ferry.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Joseph Cloud, William Black and John Smith be and they hereby are appointed commissioners to review a certain part of the state road, laid out by virtue of an act, passed on the twenty-second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and nine, from John G. Parke's, in the township of Sads bury, in the county of Chester, to M'Call's ferry on the river Susquehanna, beginning at John Moore's limekiln, in the township of Sadsbury aforesaid, from thence to the Octorara creek, at the Lancaster county line. And if the said commissioners or a majority of them, after viewing, do find occasion to alter or vary the same, they shall have power so to do, and cause a survey and draft of said alteration to be made, and make a return thereof to the court of quarter sessions of Chester county, and if approved by the said court, the same shall be filed in the clerk's office thereof, which
