## CHAPTER LXXIV.

## AN ACT

To provide for the erection of a State Penitentiary on the public land adjoining the town of Allegheny opposite Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That a penitentiary on the principle of solitary confinement of the convicts as the same now is or hereafter may be established by law, shall be erected on the public land adjoining the town of Allegheny in the county of Allegheny, and that the sum of sixty thousand dollars be, and the same \$60,000 apis hereby appropriated for that purpose, to be paid in the man-propriated.

SECT. 7. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said board of inspectors may and shall at any time after such sale, with the consent of a majority of the fot for a new commissioners of the county of Philadelphia, the mayor, alpenitentiary, dermen and citizens of Philadelphia, the commissioners of the Northern Liberties, and commissioners of the district of Southwark, or any two of the said corporations, the mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia being one, select and purchase for the use of the city and county of Philadelphia a suitable, spacious and convenient lot within the same for the scite of a new penitentiary or public prison.

Secr. 8. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said inspectors may and shall erect or cause to be erected on the lot so purchased, a new penitentiary or public prison adapted to the solitary confinement of convicts, and draw their checks or orders on the Bank of Pennsylvania for so much of the monies accrued from the sale hereinbefore authorised as shall from time to time be wanted for paying the purchase money of such lot, and the necessary expenses of erecting thereon such new penitentiary or public prison, and in favor of the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia for such surplus as shall remain or exoced the estimated or actual expense of such lot and building.

Accounts of the inspectors how to pe audited.

Sect. 9. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the accounts of said inspectors shall be annually examined, audited and settled by the auditors of the said county in the manner prescribed by law for the settlement of other

accounts appertaining to the affairs of said county.
