

CHAPTER LXXV.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to incorporate the Bible Society of Philadelphia."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That each person on becoming a member of the said society, shall on his admission and annually thereafter pay to the said society for their use, such sum as the society shall by their order from time to time think proper to establish, provided that the same do not exceed the sum of five dollars; and that each person who shall subscribe and pay to the said society thirty dollars or more, shall be a member during life, without any further or annual contribution.

The Society may establish the sum payable on admission and annually. § 30 to constitute a membership for life.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the third article of the third section of the act to which this a supplement, be and the same is hereby repealed.
