

CHAPTER CVI.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled, an act to enable the Governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road by the best and nearest route from Waterford in the county of Erie, through Meadville and Franklin to the river Susquehanna at or near the mouth of Anderson's creek in Clearfield county; and also to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the town of Northumberland, in the county of Northumberland, by the best and nearest route to the west branch of Susquehanna river, at or near the mouth of Anderson's creek, passing through Derrstown, Youngmantown, Aaronsburg, Bellefonte and Milesburg.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of an act of the General Assembly of this commonwealth, passed the twenty-second of February one thousand eight hundred and twelve, entitled "An act to enable the Governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road by the best and nearest route from Waterford in the county of Erie, through Meadville and Franklin to the river Susquehanna at or near the mouth of Anderson's creek in Clearfield county; and also to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the town of Northumberland in the county of Northumberland, by the best and nearest route to the west branch of the Susquehanna river at or near the mouth of Anderson's creek, passing through Derrstown, Youngmanstown, Aaronsburg, Bellefonte and Milesburg," and of a supplement thereto, passed the fourteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, as has expired on the twenty-second day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, be and the same is hereby revived and continued for five years from and after the passing of this act. Parts of a former law and supplement thereto revived for five years.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That William P. Dewees, Reuben Hains and Charles Norris of the city of Philadelphia; Hardman Philips and Joseph M. Fox of Centre county; George Kremer and William Hays of Union county; John Taggart and John B. Haines of Northumberland county, be, and they hereby are appointed commissioners in addition to those heretofore appointed, who or a majority of the whole number in each county shall on or before the first day of June next open books, receive subscriptions, and proceed in the manner in the said acts directed. Additional commissioners named. Their duties.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-*
said, That so much of the said act as directs that Milesburg
shall be one of the points through which the said road shall
pass, be, and the same is hereby repealed, and that the pre-
sident, managers and company of the Northumberland and
Anderson's creek turnpike road, shall cause the same to be laid
out and constructed either through Milesburg or such other
route to Philipsburg, as they shall on a full and deliberate ex-
amination of the ground, and view of the advantages of the
different routes deem the most advantageous to the public,
and thence by the nearest and best route to the river Susque-
hanna at or near the mouth of Anderson's creek.

CHAPTER CVII.

AN ACT

For the relief of Sarah Sassaman.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-*
sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General
Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the
same, That the accountant officers be authorised and direct-
ed to adjust and pay to Sarah Sassaman, of Montgomery
county, or order, the amount principal and interest due up to
the second Tuesday of January one thousand eight hundred
and seven, on a loan office certificate drawn in favor of Jo-
seph Gross, or bearer, for ten pounds ten shillings and six
pence, bearing date the first day of January one thousand
seven hundred and eighty-seven, any law to the contrary not-
withstanding.
