shall forthwith deliver possession of the lower part of the State House in the city of Philadelphia to the mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia, and in case of their neglecting or refusing so to do, on notice in writing being given by the mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia of such neglect or refusal to the sheriff of the city and county of Philadelphia, the said sheriff is hereby required and enjoined to deliver possession of the said premises to the said mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia, in the same manner as sheriffs are directed to do by the act for the sale of goods distrained for rent, passed the twenty-first day of March seventeen hundred and seventy-two.

CHAPTER CXVI.

AN ACT

To compensate Thomas Stokely, a captain of rangers serving on the frontiers during the revolutionary war.

WHEREAS the provisions of certain acts of assembly passed on the first of March seventeen hundred and eighty, the tenth of April seventeen hundred and eighty-one, and the first of October seventeen hundred and eighty-one, have been considered not literally to extend to or embrace the case of Thomas Stokely, who from a change of and continuance in service or captivity during the whole war, could be deemed a supernumerary or deranged officer as described in said act; and it is unjust that by the continuance of his service or captivity he should be deprived of equal pay and emoluments to those enjoyed by other officers, who neither served or suffered to the extent he has done.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the

same. That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to captain Thomas Stokely, or his order; the sum of two thousand four hundred dollars in full of his commutation of pay for services rendered during the revolutionary war. Things fort y

CHAPTER CXVII.

AN ACT

To establish a fourteenth judicial district, and for other purposes.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General 🤜 The counties Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the first Monday of November of Beaver, next, the counties of Beaver, Butler and Allegheny shall con-Butler and stitute the fifth judicial district of this commonwealth, and Allegheny to constitute a fifth judicial district.
