terest not exceeding six per centum per annum, as may be necessary to meet the demands which may be made on the treasury within the present year, not exceeding in the whole the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, and the faith of this commonwealth is hereby pledged for the re-imbursement of the said loan or loans within four years, and in such instalments as may be agreed on by the parties.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Governor be, and he is hereby directed to lay Report to be before the legislature within the first week of their next sesting legislature.

For laying out and opening a state road from Meadville to the west line of Pennsylvania, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1.
