#### CHAPTER CXXXV.

## AN ACT

For the relief of the late State Treasurer.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to William Findlay, late Treasurer of this Commonwealth, the sum of six hundred and ninety dollars, as an indemnification for the receipt of counterfeit bank notes, and other mistakes incident to said office.
